The much needed rains have delayed the project some. All of the utilities have been relocated and the work site has been leveled. We are ready to begin digging the footings and then we will pour the basement walls. Already, the cement floor for the second level has been completed and is stacked on a yard in Sioux Falls waiting to be delivered. The framers are adjusting their schedules to account for the weather delays. God has this project exactly where He wants it and I am striving to be okay with that. We have about \$350,000 to begin with and I expect that we will need another \$150k to enclose the structure. Financial partners are my most pressing concern. If you are wanting to help in this way, let me know. Several volunteers are offering their particular services when the project gets to that point. It's exciting to see how God is moving mountains for this.

A Place to Pray

This week, I had two encounters that I wish to share with you. The first one was a lady who contacted the camp because of a conversation with one of our board members. She was looking for a place to pray, and Joey mentioned the recently completed prayer room at the camp. Coincidently, I had one class in seminary with this lady back in 2005 and had not seen her since. Somewhat recently, she had lost her husband and simply did not have the spiritual or emotional bandwidth to continue her prayer regimen in the way she had before. She came here looking for a place where she could commune with her Lord in a deeply personal way.

That same day, Judi took a phone call from another contact that I had made while at seminary maybe twenty years ago. This woman also was looking for a special place for personal prayer. Two people in one day, both from a very long time ago, calling the camp for a place to pray. Recall that, in February, a man from Kansas who would rather remain anonymous donated a fantastic bookcase with a back lit stained glass image of Jesus for a prayer room off of the balcony in the Still Waters Retreat Center.

Now, you have heard and probably read in the Bible of several times when God uses the number three to call attention to something important. Remember Peter denying Jesus three times and the Jesus restoring him three times after the resurrection. That morning, I took my devotions to the prayer room and I got down on my after-market knees and I prayed aloud to God for my concerns of the day. I don't think that my prayers were in any way out of the ordinary. But I don't often pray aloud by myself. I once prayed aloud in the Bethany sanctuary as our church was going through stuff. I prayed aloud another time at the furthest corner of the camp to confess a specific sin. And I prayed aloud that morning. There have probably been others, but those are the ones that I remember.

I am not trying to make this into something more than it was. But this was a day of prayer for me. These times give me the strength to get through each

day. Now, I am not judging any one else. I just wonder why I take these times with my savior for granted and fail to prioritize this time continually. This prayer room is a special room but it is by no mean the only place to talk with and listen to our Lord. Today, may I encourage you to find your special **place to pray**.

I met last night with our couples small group that meets each Sunday evening for bible study. We were watching a Louis Giglio study on the book of Joshua when he made a statement that profoundly affected my understanding of God. In the passage, God had assured Joshua that he would be victorious in a battle with five kings mustered against him. When Joshua's men arrived at the battlefield, the soldiers from the other armies were confused and were fighting against each other. As is stated elsewhere, this battle belonged to the Lord. That day, the primary weapon of destruction was large hail stones.

Louis pointed out other places in scripture where God was already at work before his people even arrived. I was thinking about II Chronicles, chapter 20 and King Jehoshaphat, but the bible is filled with these stories. Then, Louis took us back to the creation story. "There was evening, and there was morning—the first day." We tend to think about the day as beginning with morning and ending with evening. But, all through the night, God is at work. When we get up in the morning, sit down with our coffee and open our devotions, we should not be thinking that we are inviting God to be a part of our day. We should realize that God is already at work. We should be coming to Him to ask Him how we might fit into His plans for the day. "There was evening, and there was morning—the next day." This understanding changes my level of angst when I face the unknown. God has already been working on my problems. How shall I come along side of him and align my will with His? Mind blown! Mic dropped! Spirit of uncertainty calmed.

As the camp has grown in the past couple of years, Judi and I found ourselves hosting groups on more and more Sunday mornings. So, we specifically sought out a place to worship that was offering small groups on times other than Sunday morning. I am involved with a Monday evening men's group. Judi meets with her ladies also on Monday. Sundays we drive to this couples small group. We burn some gas making Christian fellowship a priority. We laugh with each other. We learn together. We pray together.

I want to encourage each of you to find that community. For some of you, it may be convenient to attend that Sunday School class on Sunday morning. That's great. Wherever you need to go, find others that have fun together discovering new truths about the God of creation. God is not changing. He is waiting to reveal more of His character to us. Know this: God is already invested in your problems and He will battle your enemies for you if you will be obedient and listen to His direction. ~ Jerry
