The Importance of Guest Groups

I don't often comment about our guest groups. However, I do use previous newsletters as templates. I saw an article from 2017 that mentioned that we had hosted 60 groups on 40 different weekends with the average group being about 20 people. By comparision, in 2024 we hosted 120 groups on 48 weekends many of those staying three nights. The average weekend includes almost 50 guests. The blessing is that revenue from these groups now covers our operating costs and all donations from the last several years have gone entirely to capital improvements like the Worship Center.

In 2017 I drew attention to one of those groups. While this particular antidote is from that time, the pattern continues with other guest groups today. Joseph emigrated from Rwanda because of the genocide that happened during the 1990's. He is now very passionate about teaching others to share the message of the love of Jesus Christ, especially among the immigrant population of Sioux Falls. Consider how God works when the suffering of thousands of people in south central Africa leads to the message of salvation through Jesus Christ being proclaimed in South Dakota. Our Lord Jesus is turning pain and suffering into growth for His purposes. Now, my role in this is infinitesimally small. Our staff at



camp works to insure that these groups have a hospitable space to meet and a clean, comfortable room. Jesus is at work in the hearts of our guests. When you wonder what is happening at camp, I want you to think about Joseph and others like him. Pray that all of our guests experience Jesus Christ in is space.



Sharing Our Faith Testimony

This past week, I was at our weekly men's bible study when the question was asked, "Are you prepared to share your testimony with your children?" I sometimes share my immediate thoughts without full reflection before those words spill over my lips. In all honesty, I stated that I was willing to share my public testimony. However, there were probably, no, most definitely, parts of my life that I am reluctant to share with my kids, particularly the sins of some of my secret thoughts. Dan was sitting to my left when he hit me with the better response. "Our children don't need perfect parents. Our children need redeemed parents."

Our children do not need us to be perfect. They need to know that we know the Lord of the universe and that that Lord has also forgiven us, redeemed us at the cost of his own life and promised us a relationship by defeating death. Our children need to know that we believe in this God and that, because of our belief, that we will spend eternity with Him. They don't need to believe that our mostly good living has earned us anything. Our children need to know the story of how God met us personally and the a little of situation when we responded to His grace and love. They need to know that story. They need to know that our encounter was real, that it was personal and that we believe it. It is really a story of God's love. Our situation and the events of our encounter serve to give proper context. It's not about us. Our testimony is another story about the Lord of Easter reaching down to us and offering eternal hope. Sharing our testimony is about giving our children every advantage to believe in that same Savior for themselves. It is our most precious gift that we can give our children.
